COVID-19 Testing and Vaccination Update

San Juan County leads the state in vaccination rates. Thank you, Orcas Island and San Juan County residents, for doing your part to end this pandemic! Unfortunately the fight is not over. We still have work to do with our younger populations, those ages 12 through 34 have significantly lower rates of vaccination compared to those over 35 years of age. We're also seeing alarming hospitalization rates; the highest they've been throughout the entire pandemic. For hospitals to operate at sustainable levels, we're asking people to please get vaccinated as soon as possible, wear a mask, stay home when ill and get tested if you've been exposed or have COVID-like symptoms.

TESTING

Island Primary Care – Orcas offers **COVID-19 testing by appointment only** on Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 11 am - 12 pm, and Tuesdays from 4 - 6 pm. Testing is available for:

- Patients who have COVID-like symptoms.
- Patients who have been exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Pre-procedure tests.

Testing for travel purposes is postponed until further notice.

Ray's Pharmacy offers PCR testing Tuesdays and Thursdays for travel, school, camp, work and procedure requirements.
